Dear Parishioners,

What kind of power and authority does Jesus want us to exercise on his behalf? In our Gospel this morning Jesus gives his Apostles both the authority and power to speak and to act in his name. He commanded them to do the works which he did -- to cast out demons, to heal, and to proclaim the word of God which is the good news of the Gospel which they received from Jesus. When Jesus spoke of power and authority he spoke in a fundamentally radical and different way. He combined power and authority with love and humility. The world seeks power for selfish gain and authority to control. Jesus teaches us to use authority and power to serve God and neighbour.

Why does Jesus tell the apostles to "travel light" with little or no provision? Because the lifestyle of Jesus and the Apostles was a statement in itself in challenging the sedentary bases of power founded on land and family/kin. Jesus promoted a radically alternative set of values. The social dislocation which he challenged some to take upon themselves called into question the dominant values of society which kept the poor poor. Whether among the travellers or among those who stayed in their community, Jesus called people to be and bear good news for the poor. No wonder the established power structures of family and land and religion saw this as a great threat and did their best to tame him and his followers.

"Poverty of spirit" frees us from greed and focussing too hard on possessions and gives us plenty of room for God's provision and discernment of his grace. Our Lord wants us to be dependent on him and not on ourselves. He wants to work through and in each of us for his glory and for our own journey of discipleship individually and communally. Are we ready to handle this power and authority which God wishes us to exercise on his behalf? The Lord certainly entrusts us with his gifts and talents. Are we keen to place ourselves at his service, to do whatever he bids us, and to witness his truth and saving power to whomever he sends us?
