Dear Parishioners,

What does the image of a shepherd tell us about God? Being a shepherd was one of the oldest occupations in Israel, even before farming, since the Israelites had travelled from place to place, living in tents, and driving their flocks from one pasture to another. Certainly looking after sheep was no easy task for it required a great deal of skill, organisation and courage. Herds were often quite large, hundreds or even thousands of sheep and the flocks spent a good part of the year out in the open country. Watching over them as shepherd required a lot of attention and care.

Sheep who strayed from the flock had to be tracked down and brought back by the shepherd. Jackals, wolves, and even bears were common in first century Palestine and preyed on sheep. Shepherds often had to do battle with these wild, unpredictable and dangerous beasts. Shepherds had to put their life on the line in defending their sheep, taking it in turn to watch the sheep at night and ward off any attackers. The sheep and their shepherds spent much time together. Their life was so intimately bound together that an individual sheep, even when mixed with other flocks, could recognize the voice of their own shepherd and would come immediately when called by name.

The Old Testament often spoke of God as shepherd of his people, Israel. *The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want* (Psalm 23:1). *We are his people, and the sheep of his pasture* (Psalm 100:3). The Messiah is also pictured as the shepherd of God's people: *He will feed his flock like a shepherd, he will gather the lambs in his arms* (Isaiah 40:11). Jesus told his disciples that he was the Good Shepherd who was willing to lay down his life for his sheep (Matthew 18:12, Luke 15:4, John 10). When he saw the multitude of people in need of protection and care, he was moved to respond with compassion. His love was a love for each and every person who came to him in need. In I Peter 2:25 Jesus is called *Shepherd and Guardian of our souls*.

Do you know the peace of a life freely submitted to Jesus, the Good Shepherd? In the person of the Lord Jesus we see the unceasing vigilance, patience and caring of God's love. In our battle against sin the world and the devil, Jesus is ever ready to give us help, strength, and refuge. Jesus the Great Shepherd of the sheep asks you to trust in his grace and help at all times.
